There are many volunteer opportunities for children and for their families including a variety of special events such as food drives, fund-raisers, and the annual Holiday Give-A-Way Program. At Risk Children and Their Families

Hamilton County Museum of History

(Old Sheriff's Residence & Jail) The Hamilton County Museum of History is located in the Old Sheriff's Residence & Jail on the Courthouse Square in downtown Noblesville. The building, listed in the National Register of Historic Places, is currently under restoration. The exterior has been recently restored to its original grandeur of 1875, and the Hamilton County Historical Society is currently restoring the interior of the building.

The museum will house permanent displays of the Victorian era as well as changing exhibits depicting the history of Hamilton County, and will feature exhibits on law enforcement and inmate history.

Although the museum will be closed during restoration, tours can be arranged by appointment. For more information, write to Hamilton County Historical Society, P.O. Box 397, Noblesville, IN 46060.

Deer Creek Music Center

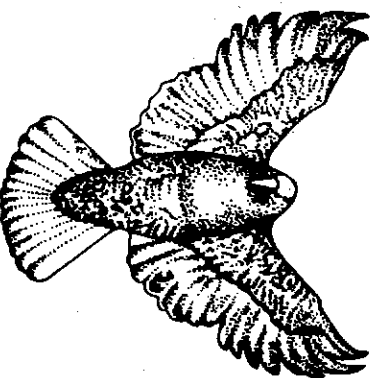

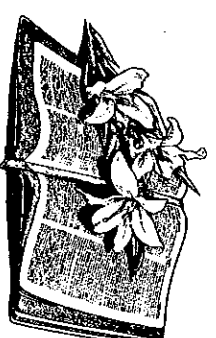
